Thomas J. Umberg has extensive trial experience in both federal and state courts and has been selected as a “Best Lawyer” for the prestigious publication “The Best Lawyers in America®” in commercial litigation for 10 consecutive years.

Tom has successfully tried over 100 cases to verdict or judgment; including complex matters involving health care, real estate, work place harassment, construction defects, employee pension plans, etc. As a federal criminal prosecutor, he tried numerous white collar and civil rights cases, including tax evasion schemes. These include “Uranium for Tax Dollars,” “Marco Numismatics” (a nationwide fraud on seniors), and the “Westminster Cross Burning” cases.

Tom served three terms in the California Legislature. While in the Assembly, Tom served as Chair of the Environmental Safety and Toxic Materials Committee. As an assemblyman, he wrote 58 measures that were signed into law, including statutes involving election reform, campaign finance reform, white collar crime, mortgage fraud, telemarketing fraud, hate crimes, toxic waste cleanup, housing loans, High Speed Rail Transport, and other transportation issues. In addition, from 2008 to 2014 Tom served in various capacities on the California High Speed Rail Authority (CHSRA), including as Chairman. (The CHSRA is responsible for developing the high speed rail system from Anaheim to San Francisco.) In 1997, Tom was selected by President Clinton to serve as Deputy Director of the White House Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP). In this capacity he was responsible for the development and coordination of United States policy to reduce the supply of illegal drugs, including negotiation and coordination with foreign governments to enhance US counter-drug intelligence and interdiction.

Tom is a retired US Army Colonel. During his Army career, he served in Korea with the 2nd Infantry Division, with NATO forces in Italy, and as a paratrooper with the US Army Special Operations Command, US Army Special Warfare Center and the XVIIIth Airborne Corp. As a JAG officer, he tried over 50 felony cases in Korea, Italy, and the United States. Tom was recalled to active duty in 2004 as a war crimes prosecutor, and in 2009 as the Chief, Anti-Corruption, in Afghanistan.

In 2011, Tom was appointed Co-Chair of the U.S. State Department’s Public Private Partnership for Justice Reform in Afghanistan.

Tom is a member of the Board of Directors of the National Association of Drug Court Professionals and is Chair of the Veterans Treatment Court Committee.

In 2015, Tom was selected by the federal judiciary to be an attorney representative to the Ninth Circuit Judicial Confere

## REPRESENTATIVE MATTERS

- Represented Fortune 100 Energy Corporation in FERC and California Attorney General investigations. No fines or charges were assessed or filed.
- Represented Fiber Optic Corporation before California Coastal Commission, State Lands Commission and the US Army Corps of Engineers. Permits granted to install fiber optic cable off the California coast.
- Represented a major Defense Contractor in a Foreign Corrupt Practices investigation by the U.S. Department of Justice and the UK Ministry of Defence. The investigation concluded with no adverse consequences to the client.
- Represented the judges of the Orange County Superior Court when they successfully sued the county over trial court funding.
